Position Mission Statement

The Parent Educator helps families thrive by providing in-home services to parents of prenatal through early childhood-aged children. They do this through goal setting, plan development, and progress monitoring as they provide developmental screenings and parent education. They work with parents to develop long-term family safety, stability, and success (physically, emotionally, socially/relationally, and financially). The Parent Educator performs additional duties as a Circle of Care team member in our efforts to bring large scale, long term, positive change for the Chambers Co. & Greater Valley Area to the benefit of Individuals, Families, and especially Children.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Recruit an active caseload of 15 Lee County families as well as additional 5 families for a waiting list through self-referrals, inter-office referrals, or referrals through a number of community agencies.
- Schedule, conduct, and document regular home visitation sessions with participating parents and their children, delivering assigned curriculum designed to teach basic parenting skills and child development.
- Work with Center Case Manager to ensure families are properly accessing available community resources.
- Work with Home Visitation Supervisor to ensure work is meeting grant requirements.
- Collaborate with community partner agencies to access services for participating families
- Complete required paperwork, grant reports, and documentation in various programmatic and Center databases.
- Attend any required meetings planned by grant giving agencies.
- Coordinate activities of volunteers who may be available to provide services for the program preparation
- Build strong, healthy relationships with organization service recipients, staff, and partners.
- Evaluate program effectiveness
